I-I (brief) Update – October 30th 2015

Hello Again Friends, Members & Supporters - It has been a busy few months for those of us involved in the administration of the I-I project as we endeavour to keep abreast with hundreds of new membership applications and the underhanded activities of certain State agencies who are doing their level best to suppress our efforts to secure justice and fair treatment for ordinary citizens. Apart from our battles in the Courts and our ongoing efforts to charge errant authority figures with criminal offences, we are also in the process of setting up local groups whereby we will be delegating responsibilities to local Facilitators - and to this end we have, this past week, sorted through nearly 2,700 'pending' emails. We ask that prospects and existing members please be patient with our efforts to consolidate these local groups because the response from the public has been, quite frankly, overwhelming, but plans are afoot to move the I-I project forwards as soon as we can organise these local Facilitators who in turn will head up local 'Action Panels'. This development cannot be overemphasised. It is absolutely vital that members respond if we are to keep the I-I project growing in strength and effectiveness. So if you are willing and able to be a Facilitator (which only requires that you manage a local database) please contact us 'asap' at 'admin@integrityireland.ie' to discuss the process. Thank you.

The other major development is the publication of *The Integrity Ireland 'S.O.S' Guide: Dealing with corruption, cronyism and criminality in the Irish Justice System*. It is hoped that the 'SOS Guide' will serve a number of functions: (1) It will be a solid introduction for prospective members who want to understand, (a) what 'the problem' is, and (b) how we intend dealing with it. (2) It will relieve some of the pressure on I-I administrators who are at present overwhelmed with emails, texts and phone calls. (3) It will serve as an operations manual for local groups and facilitators, and (4) it will help raise some much-needed funds for the proposed I-I Office. So please, don't be shy. Order your copy now and let's make sure we are all singing from the same hymn-sheet.
